Tips for preparing:


- 1. Read and pray the articles of the Rule/Constitutions which apply to that lesson
- 2. Read and pray over any scripture that goes along with the topic (see Initial formation syllabus)
- 3. Read any reference to the CCC
- 4. Read the chapter in the Franciscan Journey
- 5. Read the Chapter in the FUN Manual
- 6. Refer to other materials available as extra resources from the FUN Manual

As you read the material decide:

- What portion you will present and how you will present it
 - Take into account the abilities and interests of those in formation/ongoing formation
 - Take into account what elements are absolutely essential for the participants to take away
- Transformational aspect
- Items to be re-enforced by questions/discussion

The Goal is to help those being formed to:

- Understand what a vocation is
- Discern whether or not they have a vocation
- Intensify and better understand their Catholicism
- · Start becoming part of the family
- Understand and internalize the culture of being a Franciscan
- Begin to understand the Franciscan charism
- Understand the importance of the Rule they will eventually profess
- Realize that they are on the road to being <u>transformed!</u>



Respectful Communication Guidelines (Fr. Eric Law at 2007 Quinquennial)

R = Take RESPONSIBILITY for what you say

E = Use Empathic listening

S = Be **SENSITIVE** to different communication styles

P = PONDER what you hear and feel before you respond

E = EXAMINE your own assumptions and perceptions

C = Keep CONFIDENTIALITY

T= TRUST ambiguity (We are not here to debate who is right or wrong.)
