Answer: INITIAL FORMATION BOOKS

In January 2023 we initiated our Initial Formation Program with 5 Aspirants. We developed a very comprehensive Study Program where we incorporated different aspects very necessary about the "meaning of who we are". To that effect, we elaborated the study plan based in the "Guidelines for Initial Formation Program."

The Initial Formation Students meet two times per month, for about 2 Hours, and study each of the materials necessary for the comprehensive formation. During the year 2023, the Initial Formation Students, dedicated a total of 44 Hours of instructions.

 How often has your fraternity discussed the Status of Instrumentum Laboris?

Answer: The Fraternity has been concentrating much of this year on two of the main goals of Instrumentum Laboris: OFS Formation and Franciscan Servant Leadership.

What initial goals has your fraternity made as a result of Instrumentum

Laboris (IL)?

Answer:

- 1. First Initial OFS IL Goal provide to members true and authentic Catholic Franciscan Initial /Ongoing Formation, from teachers educated in Catholic and Franciscan studies.
 - a. Our Formation Director, Jose Chaviano, OFS is very knowledgeable in Catholic Franciscan Formation and has advanced Theology degrees, with emphasis on Franciscan studies. (Please reference the answer previously regarding Initial and Ongoing Formation Books used by St Joseph Fraternity). Our Fraternity is very blessed to have such a good teacher, with extensive background in Catholic and Franciscan studies, which he continues to study to this day. The Fraternity is very blessed to have Jose rightly and lovingly lead both our Initial and Ongoing Formation, despite having great difficulty with his eyesight.
- 2. Second Initial OFS IL Goal Understanding and implementing more rightly, fully, and justly, the OFS Franciscan Servant Leadership Handbook.

Father Nicholas Mormando OFM., Cap. is the Spiritual Assistant for St Joseph Fraternity. In 2023 Father Nick started a committee, consisting of Fr Nick, Jose Chaviano, Formation Director and Toni Coffer, OFS member to assist on this project to more deeply comprehend and implement, in holiness, some of the rich material in the Fr Servant Leadership Handbook. The committee is in

the process of compiling an "Addendum" using the Instrument Laboris as a reference to enhance the understanding and comprehension of the entire study, of "The Franciscan Servant Leadership Handbook," which should help to enlighten the minds and hearts of the members as how to process the individual implementation of the original "OFS Franciscan Servant Leadership Handbook more rightly and effective to growth in the application and acknowledge of each member in our Fraternity.

The Fraternity will be having a few Workshops in 2024 led by the committee of Fr Nick, Jose, and Toni to discuss the topic of Franciscan Servant Leadership Exact date in 2024 to be determined. The goal is to increase the Fraternity's understanding and holy implementation of the existing "Franciscan Servant Leadership Handbook" knowledge and skills throughout the use of the new "Franciscan Servant Leadership Addendum" designed by the St Joseph Fraternity Committee consisting of Fr Nick, Jose, and Toni. As a. complement necessary to the original document and the Instrument Laboris. We strongly believe that the work performed for our committee in the design of the documents included in the Addendum will serve as a necessary step for the entire study.

Do you have a local fraternity Newsletter and how often is it published?

Answer: The St Joseph Fraternity Newsletter, named "The Instrument" is published about 10 times a year; rest of year, basic information sent to members by email.

• How is it distributed?

Answer: The St Joseph Fraternity Newsletter, named "The Instrument" is distributed by email. If members are ill and do not read their emails or do not have email, sometimes a fellow member will phone to check up on them and tell them of any pertinent Fraternity news.

• Have you thought of sharing your newsletter with the bishop, regional executive council, etc.?

Answer: We usually share our newsletter with Hilda, our Family Councilor, and Brother Lombardo, our Regional Spiritual Assistant.

- What Apostolic work does your fraternity do as a whole fraternity?
- What percentages of the fraternity participate?
- A) The 2023 Apostolic work that the whole St Joseph Fraternity works on are:
 - 1. Apostolic Work Name = Seafarers outreach to men/women who work aboard ships Apostolic Action: Fraternity donates items needed by Seafarers', such as, toiletries, clothes, writing items.
 - 2. Apostolic Work Name = Assistance to foster young adults who will be living in their first own living spaces.

Apostolic Action: Fraternity donated goods for these foster young adults, to fill their new living spaces, such as kitchen or bath goods.

3. Apostolic Work Name = San Pedro Annual Convention 2023 Outreach to Homeless in San Pedro area.

Apostolic Action: Fraternity donated various goods, such as, clothes, socks, toiletries for homeless in San Pedro area; these goods were brought by St Joseph Fraternity representative to the Annual 2023 OFS FFMR San Pedro Convention for distribution to homeless in San Pedro area.

- 4. Our fraternity donates bags to carry food that is prepared for homeless in Miami.
- 5. Donations of school supplies, which were destroyed by flood, to St Jerome Catholic School Teachers
- 6. 2023 Planning Centenary: Jose Chaviano and Miguel/Nanette invited & attended Spanish National ZOOM Talk on OFS Centenary Events scheduled 2023 on Greccio/Later Rule- then whole Fraternity participated in their Centenary production of O Antiphons to celebrate Greccio Dec 2023 in person or by ZOOM.
- B) About 80% of Fraternity participates in donating goods/money for our Apostolic work.

• <u>Does your fraternity attend Mass or prayer services outside the regular meeting times?</u>

- 6. Some members celebrated Feast of St Francis together by phone, liturgy, Transitus
- 7. Many members meet other members or singularly: pray together; attend Mass,

pray Lectio Divina on phone, teach catechism, attend Bible study, volunteer Respect Life, active Catholic music ministry, member Knights of Columbus, Women of Grace, Eucharistic Minister, Prison Ministry, help homeless ministry, Good Samaritan, Emmaus Retreat men & women servant.

What has been your fraternity's greatest challenges this past year?

Answer: Greatest challenges in 2023:

Overall: Assisting the Professed members to stay focused on doing the things that need to be done to re-strengthen their Franciscan charism.

Specifically:

- 1.) To become more imbued with the Rule and Constitutions to revitalize the Franciscan spirit among/within the members.
- 2.) To recognize that "On Going Formation" is as necessary a part of the monthly fraternity meeting as gathering with one another to share strengthen fraternal bonds among the members.
- 3.) Reminding the professed members that they made profession in a Secular Religious Order as opposed to any other kind of religious groups /gathering that are found within the Catholic Church (i.e., prayer groups, Bible studies, Charismatic and Marian movements, etc.) and that living the Gospel Life given to us through St. Francis, is their predominant spirituality.

What is your fraternity's strongest asset(s)?

- 1. The willingness of those professed members, who bear the weight of leadership, that is seeing us through a time of transition to greater life and vitality. They are making a tremendous personal sacrifice so as to benefit the life of the fraternity.
- 2. We have new candidates who are solid individuals and who have a strong commitment to their formation process. They are hungry for Franciscan spirituality and are willing to commit themselves to the Gospel life.
- 3. We have a Formation Director who is very capable of providing both initial and ongoing formation. He is a true teacher who is able to teach the Franciscan way of life.
- 4. The professed members of the fraternity who are willing to do their part in taking on responsibilities as needed for revitalizing the fraternity.
- 5. We are trying to be a better fraternity. We are not where we were three years ago, but growth needs to happen.
