

Message from Jeane Swaynos, OFS FFMR Regional Minister

On May 16-18 over 25 fraternities gathered together with Father Jerome Wolbert OFM and Donna Hollis OFS from the National Fraternity at our Chapter meeting. This visitation takes place once every three years, but this was the first time a friar had extended his visit and took time to visit the local fraternities as well. We gathered together at the San Pedro Center with over 75 people for our Annual Chapter Meeting and a personal visit from people on the National Council. This Chapter meeting was in the middle of Father Jerome's visit to local fraternities in the region. He conducted partial and full visitations to 16 local fraternities along with a presentation in southwest Florida. He arrived on May 9th in Tampa, then traveled East to Melbourne, South to Boynton Beach, back north to San Pedro, then on to Daytona and Tallahassee. He then proceeded to Debary, back to the west coast, and finally completed his adventure on May 26th in Cape Coral. We kept him busy and the reports to local fraternities will follow. After he left us, he went on to visit other regions in the country, so he apologizes for being behind in his report.

During the gathering at San Pedro, he met and connected with many other brothers and sisters in local fraternities he was not able to visit personally. His 7-page final regional report has been sent to your ministers to share with you where you will find his reaction to these visits. He shared specific ways to help us grow. For many fraternities that have not seen a friar for many years, this was a spark that was much needed. He now better understands our struggle being short of Spiritual Assistants and how that impacts the local fraternities.

Donna Hollis, our National Council, has also sent her fraternal report. After you read it, please share any comments with her as well. Since we have had her as a councilor for over six years, she has a special relationship with many of us, and this is reflected in her report.

Please feel free to write and communicate with Father Jerome and Donna. They are there to continue to guide us and help us grow closer to our Franciscan spirituality. Thank you all for reaching out and accommodating this special visit. You all contributed to its success.

Regional Visitation Highlights Jeane Swaynos, OFS, FFMR Regional Minister

Here are some of the highlights in the reports from our Visitors. Many of these can be implemented at the local fraternity level. Fr. Jerome's report, along with Donna's report, was sent to your local minister. Be sure you have an opportunity to read it.

- Success We updated our Regional Guidelines, and our Previsitation and Election forms.
- Care of aging members Work to build strong fraternal relationships by examining how you include those who frequently cannot attend meetings in person.
- **Help find Spiritual Assistants** Assist the OFS Animator in finding a spiritual assistant for your fraternity. While it is the friars' responsibility first, if you are near people who might serve and the friars are far away, they will still need your help to identify such people and will rely on your research to find someone, else they may appoint a person not suitable for your particular fraternity.
- Rekindle your fraternity's relationship with Friars Connect (or reconnect) with the friars who established your fraternity and the friar province to which you are currently bonded; these are not necessarily the same.
- Read Rules and Constitution Ensure that all in leadership indeed all those capable of leadership have read not only the Rule but also the General Constitutions, the International Statutes, and the National Statutes, and are aware of where to find what type of guidance and perspective. This would be good ongoing council formation: to read legislation and then let each council member share what surprises them or what helps us live our OFS vocation.

At the house of Martha and Mary

Lk 10:38 As Jesus and his disciples were on their way, He came to a village where a woman named Martha opened her home to Him. 39 She had a sister called Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet listening to what He said. 40 But Martha was distracted by all the preparations that had to be made. She came to Him and asked, "Lord, don't you care that my sister has left me to do the work by myself? Tell her to help me!"

41 "Martha, Martha," the Lord answered, "you are worried and upset about many things, 42 but few things are needed—or indeed only one. Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her."

I have always felt a kinship with Martha. Being a mother and grandmother in charge of all the holiday festivities, along with acting as a host for many community fundraisers, I knew firsthand that there were many details that needed full attention, swift decisions, and action. Poor Martha, there she was with a deluge of disciples entering her home, unannounced, and she needing to provide Hebrew Hospitality for everyone. Comfortable seating arrangements had to be found while food and drink had to be served immediately.

Yes, I empathized with Martha.

But we Franciscans scour the Gospels for deeper meaning—ways that we may use these writings to live our Charism of Gospel to Life, Life to Gospel We work to see how Luke can be understood and applied to assist our lives to grow richer in the Lord.

It is easy to see that we Seculars are experts at being Marthas in our Fraternities. The Minister is setting up Gatherings and completing Regional Reports. The secretary is typing up minutes, sending out cards, and keeping attendance. The treasurer is going to the bank and posting the available funds while keeping an eye on the next Fair Share. The Formation Director is planning a yearlong theme for ongoing formation, while keeping track of where the Candidates are in their studies. The members are signing up to bring refreshments and working diligently on the Fraternity's Apostolate and upcoming events. We have Martha down pat.

Let us stop and recall when Saint Francis asked Saint Clare which he should be — Contemplative or Active — she said both. And from that moment we Franciscans have taken that to heart, but perhaps not practice.

Jesus taught that Mary's contemplation of His words, the turning them in her mind into understanding was the better part. No matter how busy, no matter how important, no matter how demanding our actions are we must stop and sit at the foot of Jesus and let Him speak to us in quiet and clam and peace. That is how we truly live our Charism.

Secular Franciscans throughout our Region are practicing Mediation, Lectio Divina, and using the two pillars of Morning and Evening Prayer to merge the outreach of Martha to the quietness of Mary. This oneness of purpose does not come easy, but with daily discipline and love. Thus, we will grow in our Solemn Promise of Poverty to the World by being deliberately still.

Jesus, I am listening.

Fr. Marek Stybor, OFM Conv.




