- What initial goals has your fraternity set as a result of *Instrumentum Laboris*?
  - 1. Our actions continue to focus on training fraternity and council members to be able to take a place on the council.
  - 2. We continue our apostolate to seminarians for the local diocese and men in formation to become Conventual Franciscans by writing individual letters to them each month. We started in the spring of 2022, and we stop over the summer because the seminarians went home or to other temporary assignments. The purpose is to familiarize the seminarians with who we are, and, if they are secular, expose them to the Franciscan Order. Also, it will hopefully be a positive influence for potential future spiritual assistants.
  - 3. With permission from their pastors, fraternity members from different parishes place the fraternity trifold brochures in their parish churches with other handouts.
  - 4. We collected Christmas cards/envelopes for inmates at a local prison to send to families through the Diocese of Palm Beach's Prison Ministry.
  - 5. Several of our members initiated a rosary making apostolate at St. Mark Church and several of our members have made rosaries for this group. The rosaries were for the sick, home-bound, RCIA and hospitals and were donated to four local Palm Beach County hospitals.
- What goals has your fraternity reached as a result of *Instrumentum Laboris*? See above.
- Do you have a local fraternity Newsletter? {YES}

  - How is it distributed? Via email and mailed to members without email accounts.
- With whom do you share your newsletter (Bishop, Regional Executive Council, your Family Councilor, etc.)? We share our newsletter with the Bishop of the Diocese of Palm Beach's Assistant and the SE Area Councilor.
- What Apostolic work does your fraternity do as a whole fraternity? What percentages of the fraternity participate?
  - 1. Letters to Seminarians: One of the fraternity apostolates is creating a camaraderie with our local

seminary, St. Vincent de Paul Regional Seminary, to spread the word about our Franciscan community and life. We do this by writing individual letters to the seminarians and by sending them our bimonthly fraternity newsletter. We also hope to encourage the seminarians to inquire about the OFS. All members participate in this apostolate. In addition to communicating with the diocesan seminarians, we also have members who communicate monthly with men in Franciscan formation, so they will learn about our order and perhaps when they are professed and/or ordained, they will be familiar with our order, in the event they become spiritual assistants or promote the Third Order within parishes. 100% participate.

- **2. Food Pantry Donations:** Another apostolate is helping the needy in our area by bringing nonperishable food donations to St. Mark Church each month before our group Mass. 100% participate.
- **3. Prayers for the Deceased:** Our fraternity is dedicated to praying for deceased fraternity and family members. 100% participate. We arrange for a Sunday Mass intention for all deceased parishioners and Franciscans. In addition, many members of our fraternity, attend funerals in their parishes to pray for the deceased, even if they do not know them. We also have some who go to the interment.
- **4. Donations to Birthline/Lifeline:** This apostolate collects items for Birthline/Lifeline, a pregnancy care center in Boynton Beach. 100% participate.
- **5.** Christmas Cards for Use by Inmates: Our fraternity collected Christmas cards to be distributed to inmates in a local prison via the Diocese of Palm Beach's Prison Ministry Program. 100% participate.
- **6. Rosary Making Group:** Started by fraternity members, this group is now part of the parish's ministries. 50% participate.

Describe the activities (Mass, prayer services, etc.) your fraternity attends outside the regular gathering times. Several of our fraternity members attend daily Mass together at St. Mark Church, and others attend daily Mass together at local churches. We have gathered for Mass on both the Feasts of St. Anthony and the Portiuncula, followed by a meal. We organize a Transitus service for the parish followed by refreshments. We attend funerals. We also have mini retreats once or twice a year if we have an available friar.

- 2. We write letters to the local seminarians at St. Vincent de Paul Regional Seminary to enlighten them about the OFS.
- 3. We have a fraternity website (www.stanthonyofs.com) to promote vocations and raise the profile of our fraternity and Franciscan life.
- 4. We have a presence on Facebook (https://www.facebook.com/stanthonyofpaduafraternityflorida).
- 5. Our fraternity presence and celebration of the Feasts of St. Anthony of Padua, the Portiuncula and Transitus are shared via live stream on Facebook, along with our fraternity's hospitality.
- 6. Our fraternity commemorates Transitus with a prayer service with the friars and St. Mark parish. Afterwards, our fraternity provided refreshments for all who attended. This resulted in several individuals inquiring about our order.
- 7. We have a presence at the South Florida Fair at the Divine Mercy booth.
- 8. We created an X (formerly Twitter) account @StAnthonyOFS.
- 9. We have created a publicity campaign, creating flyers for bulletin inserts, small and medium-sized bulletin ads, and content for bulletin blurbs. This was sent to all parishes in the diocese.
- 10. We held a parish Christmas fundraiser with OFS brochures and members at a booth after Masses.

- 1. We celebrated the Feast of St. Anthony with Mass and a social.
- 2. We celebrated the Feast of the Portiuncula with Mass and a social.
- 3. Our fraternity was responsible for the Transitus Prayer Service followed by a social for the parish community.
- 4. We celebrated the Feast of St. Francis with a Solemn Mass.
- 5. In November, the fraternity requested the intentions for the 10:30am Sunday Mass on our fraternity day to be for all deceased parishioners and Franciscans. Most of our gathering centered around a prayer service commemorating each deceased member of our fraternity, the friars who died in the last 12 months, and everyone who was gathered mentioned spouses or other family/friends who died in the past 12 months.
- 6. A March 17th Franciscan Lenten Retreat with Fr. Carl Zdancewicz, OFM Conv.
- What programs/events has your Fraternity Council planned for 2025?
  - 1. Mass for our fraternity followed by a light meal on the Feast of St. Anthony.

- 2. Mass for our fraternity followed by a light meal on the Feast of the Portiuncula.
- 3. Our fraternity will plan the Transitus Prayer Service followed by refreshments for the parish community.
- 4. Our fraternity will have a presence at the 2025 South Florida Fair and will be handing out fraternity brochures and volunteering at the Divine Mercy booth.
- 5. Our fraternity is working on plans to provide a mini retreat during Lent and Advent.

- What has been your fraternity's greatest challenge this past year? Our main challenge has been with illness affecting several fraternity members and the death of two of our members.

We have received feedback over and over on how our members have a strong sense of family. Visitors have commented how they feel so welcomed. Other assets include how our members support one another along with our spiritual assistant. Also, one of our former members who moved out of the area came to visit and emphasized to the fraternity how fortunate we are because of the many opportunities we make for spirituality, and she also appreciated our adherence to OFS documents and Regional guidelines.
