   We established the Peace Awards in eleven parishes or schools to reach out to the youth and make them aware of St. Francis and our Secular Franciscans. Also, we have the St. Francis Project in one elementary school fifth grade.

We have wonderful participation from our members in Formation. Each member teaches a lesson once or twice a year every member gets to know and help our inquirers and candidates. Each member also has a chance in our rotating schedule to lead our on-going formation.

We generally pray the Liturgy of the Hours at each meeting, have a Gospel reading and reflection and a report from a member on a Franciscan Saint or Blessed.

We meet the third Saturday of each month by Zoom to pray the Franciscan Crown Rosary.

Every October we have a Transitus Ceremony to begin our October meeting and we move the meeting to by as close as possible to October 4<sup>th</sup>.

One of our members forwards emails of various novenas every month for the particular month.

Another member emails the Blessed Mother's monthly message from Medjugorje to every member.

Our Infirmarian emails all regional prayer requests from Fred Schaeffer to all of us and she contacts our lapsed/elderly members every month and reports back to the membership.

Every member has a navy blue shirt with our Fraternity Logo and a name badge to identify each of us as belonging to Little Flock Secular Franciscan Fraterntiy.

Each member takes part in our meeting by participating in a published "Contributors Cycle" in various Designated roles in the regular meeting.

Members contribute to the common fund which supports our apostolates (McGill-Toolen High School and St. Michael's High School) and the Peace Awards and St. Francis Project.

- Eleven Peace Awards and one St. Francis Project and contribute to both High Schools in the two
- Counties (Mobile and Baldwin) in which our members live.
